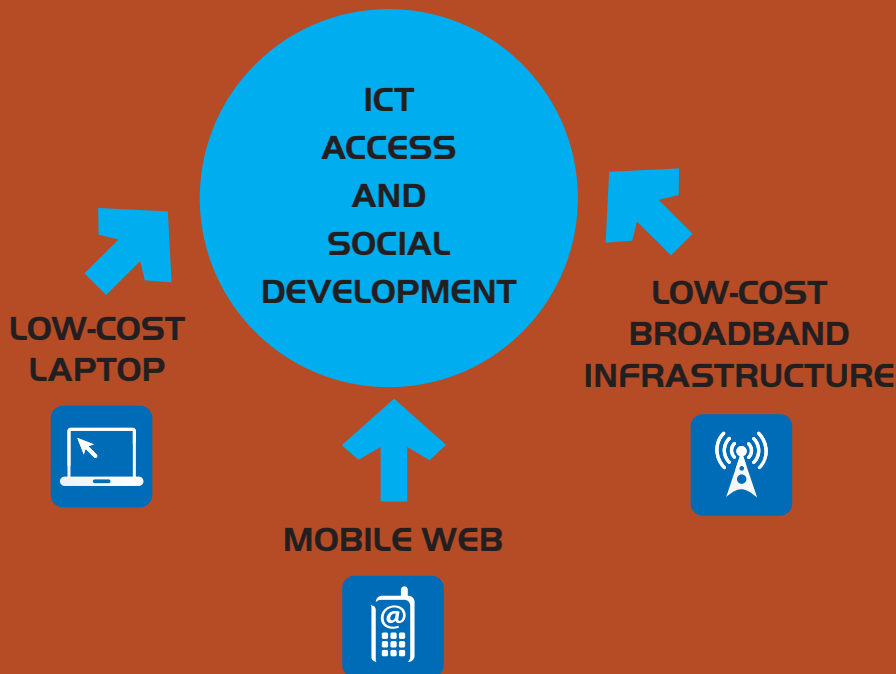

DIGITAL WORLD FORUM will explore how to take advantage of the new paradigm of low-cost technologies in broadband infrastructure and devices (mobile phones and laptop) to bridge the digital divide and connect the unconnected. The aim of Digital World Forum is to produce a state-of-the-art study in these domains, identify the challenges, and propose roadmaps to tackle them. A particular focus will be on involving local actors from industry, research and academic communities and non-governmental organizations with field expertise who will provide feedback on the key factors of adoption.

The project seeks to build a worldwide interdisciplinary forum, where experience would be shared amongst experts in mobile technologies, Web technologies, broadband infrastructure, usability, low-cost hardware, and sustainability.

Finally, government, policy makers, and local research communities have an important role to play in leveraging the adoption of technologies.
